You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

TYPE

You invest into a subordinated bearer debt obligation of the category Investment Product (Structured Note), which is subject to Austrian law and entitles the respective holder to receive amounts due from us as issuer.

TERM

This product has a fixed term until 19/03/2029.

OBJECTIVES

The aim of this product is to receive regular interest payments and to benefit from rising interest rates. The product has a variable interest rate and a fixed maturity. The variable interest rate is based on the reference interest rate plus margin. Redemption at maturity will be 100% of the nominal amount. If you purchase the product during the term, you must pay accrued interest pro rata.

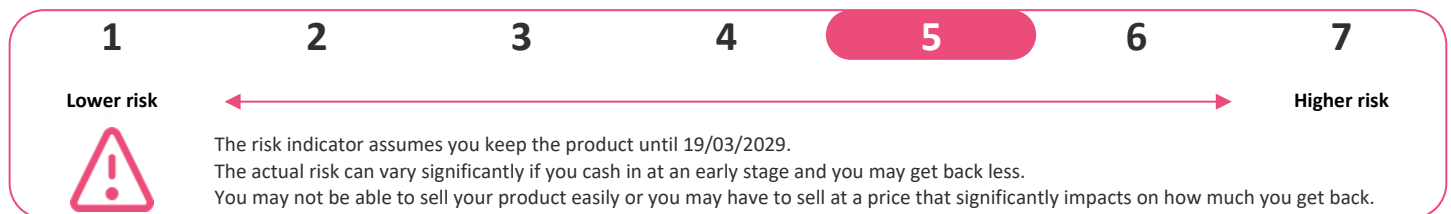
The issuer has an extraordinary right of termination and is entitled to terminate the product early for regulatory and / or tax reasons. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

RISK INDICATOR



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a very low level, and poor market conditions could impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. If the currency of the product is different from the currency of the country in which you live, you will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get will depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. What are the costs?

COSTS OVER TIME

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended Holding Period: until 19/03/2029

The product aims to generate the return described above under "What is this product?". However, only if it is held until maturity. It is therefore recommended that you hold the product until 19/03/2029 (Maturity Date). There is no other way to withdraw your money early than to sell the product over-the-counter. No fees or penalties will be charged by the Issuer for such a transaction, but an execution fee may be charged by your intermediary. If you sell the product before it matures you

may get back less than if you had held the product until maturity. In case of exceptional market situations or technical disruptions, it may be temporarily difficult or impossible to buy or sell the product.
