## What is this product?

### Type

You invest into a subordinated debt obligation of the category Investment Product (Structured Note).

### Objectives

The aim is to receive regular interest payments and to benefit from rising interest rates. The product has a variable interest rate and a fixed maturity. The variable interest rate is based on the reference interest rate plus margin. A minimum interest rate will be paid. Redemption at maturity will be 100% of the principal amount.

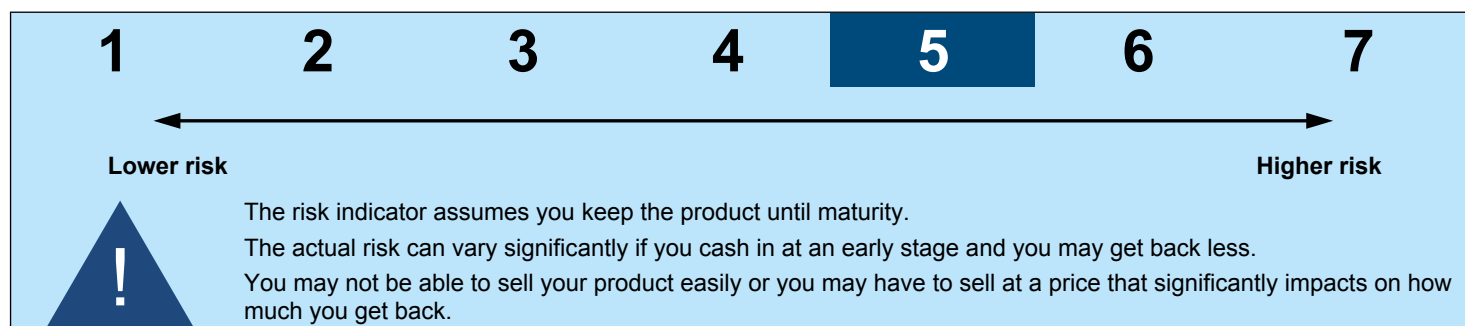

### Risk Indicator

## What are the costs?
