## What is this product?

### Type

You invest into a debt obligation of the category Investment Product (Capital Protection Note).

### Objectives

The aim is to benefit from rising prices of the underlying. The product has a fixed maturity. The redemption will depend on the performance of the underlying. No interest will be paid during the term.

Redemption at maturity will be the base rate plus the performance of the underlying multiplied by the participation rate. The participation rate determines the interest in the performance of the underlying expressed as a percentage. Performance means the percentage change in the closing price of the underlying compared to the strike price. Independent of the performance of the underlying, a minimum amount will be paid, which is equivalent to the minimum redemption rate multiplied by the principal amount.

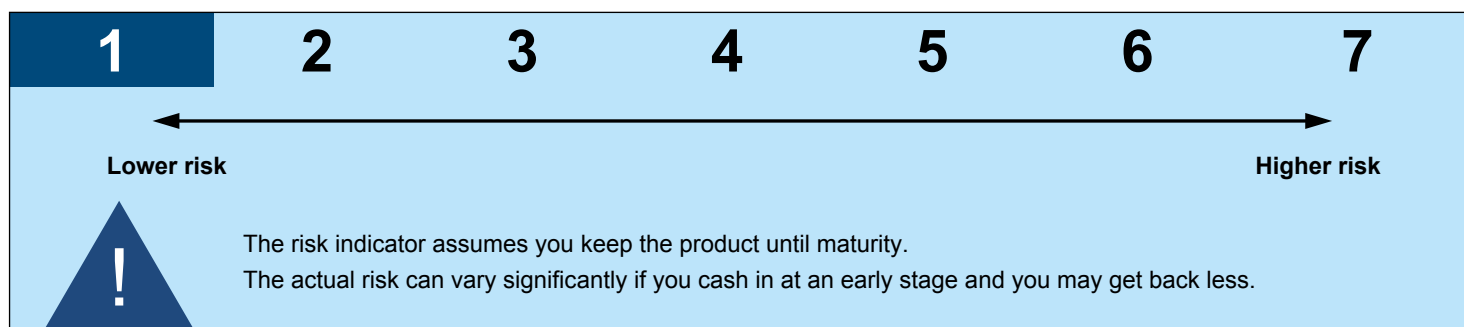
The issuer is entitled to terminate the product with immediate effect, if an extraordinary event occurs. Examples of extraordinary events include the delisting or loss of the underlying, changes in legislation, tax and regulatory events and the discontinuation of the issuer's ability to carry out the necessary hedging transactions. In this case, the redemption amount may possibly be below the purchase price, but at least 100% of the principal amount. ## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

### Risk Indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 1 out of 7, which is the lowest risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a very low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

You are entitled to receive back at least 100% of your capital. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain.
