You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type

You invest into a debt obligation of the category Investment Product (Participation Certificate).

Term

This product has no fixed term.

Objectives

The aim of this product is to provide you with the possibility to gain exposure to the performance of the Underlying. The product has no fixed maturity ("open-end") and reflects the performance of the underlying.

The redemption at the respective payout amount can be demanded from the issuer during the term. The payout amount will be equivalent to the price of the underlying multiplied by the multiplier.

Since futures have a fixed maturity, they will be replaced by an equally structured new contract with a longer term before expiry. This process is called "roll-over". Based on the roll-over costs incurred, the multiplier will be adjusted accordingly.

As the underlying is quoted in a currency different from the currency of the product, the conversion into the currency of the product is based on the relevant exchange rate.

The issuer may redeem the product at any time at the respective payout amount, provided it observes a certain period of notice.

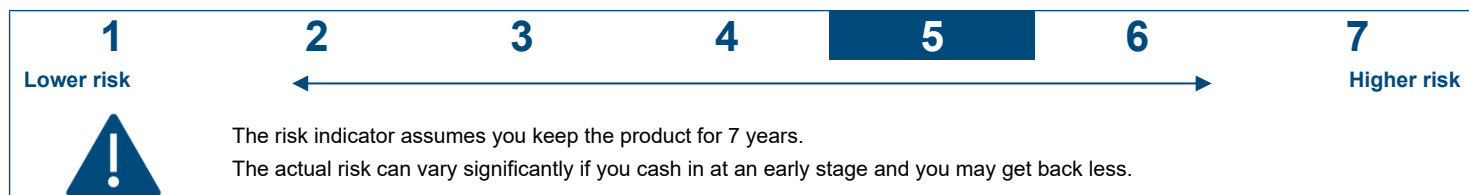
The issuer is entitled to terminate the product with immediate effect, if an extraordinary event occurs. Examples of extraordinary events include the delisting or loss of the underlying, changes in legislation, tax events and the discontinuation of the issuer's ability to carry out the necessary hedging transactions. In this case, the redemption amount may possibly be significantly below the purchase price. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-high level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk.
